JAKE Duffy kept the flag flying in the Luneng Sports Australian Junior and Cadet Open, part of the LTTF Junior Circuit at Seagulls over the Easter weekend, reaching the quarter-final of the junior boys singles before bowing out to eventual finalist Li Shilun of China. Jake, who had an OP1 score in his end-of-school exams, will put studies on hold shortly as he heads off for a six-month stint in Sweden along with Australian team member Heming Hu.

IN the National Junior & Cadet Top 10 Ranking Tournament also held at Seagulls in Tweed Heads last month, Jake came third in the Under 18 boys event while Matilda Alexandersson finished fourth and Danni-Elle Townsend placed sixth in the Under 15 girls. Queensland had 13 representatives among the 39 competitors on parade. More recently, Jackson Meyn partnered Andrea McDonnell to mixed doubles success in the Oceania Para championships in Bendigo.

THERE must have been something in the air in Mad March.. Club legend Agnes Herbertson had to withdraw from action after breaking an arm in a fall on board a tram, necessitating an absence from fixture and social play rarely witnessed in the past 30-odd years. And Steve Wilks, another long-time member whose enthusiasm is a byword among his peers, missed a Wednesday fixture for the first time in 28 years because of illness. Here's wishing both a speedy recovery.

Charlie, a man of many talents including landscaping, sourced quality turf and then put in the hard yards laying it on the bank, which now provides a brilliant backdrop. It's all part of the refurbishment of the grounds, an ongoing project in which several other volunteers have been involved. Thanks to them all.

Finally, SECRETARY and jack of most trades Lukas Kozak's familiar face will be absent for a few weeks as he undertakes a European trip as part of his annual leave. Just before his departure, Lukas, who has been a Queensland-ranked player and also dabbles successfully in indoor soccer, has been adding to his all-round sporting accomplishments by taking golf lessons from former professional and accredited coach Steven Hitchock (who says 'he's not bad').

# **Rule of the Month**

#### **How many serves?**

When the rules of table tennis were changed to make each game up to 11 points instead of 21 points, the number of serves that each player had was also changed.

Now, each player has **two serves each**, whereas in the old 21 point system, each player had five serves each.

Service continues to alternate between opponents until one player scores 11 points, unless both players or pairs score 10 points (called deuce).

If both players reach 10 points, then service alternates after each point, until one player gains a two point lead.

#### **Returning the serve**

Your opponent must hit the ball back over the net so that it bounces only on the server's side of the table and the ball must bounce at least once on the server's side of the table.

If you allow the ball to bounce more than once on your side of the table at any time, you lose the point.

When returning the serve, or during a rally, if the ball hits the net but does not hit your opponent's half of the table, then a point is awarded to your opponent.

However, if the ball hits the net but still goes over and bounces on your opponent's half of the table, the rally continues.

The receiver can stand wherever they want and can play their returns from any position. However, players are not allowed to touch the table with their free hand (the hand not holding the racket) and they are not allowed to move the table.
